

He developed his skills in the coastal fishing village where he grew up surrounded by the griots (hereditary musicians) and international musicians who were his mentors for Senegambian drumming and cultural priorities. In his late teens he formed his band Kunta Kinteh and consequently toured The Gambia, Senegal, UK and Europe. King has since built an international reputation as a master of many African drumming styles on instruments such as the Djembe, Boucarabou, Doundoun and Sabar, performing and teaching percussion to students from around the world.

EMMA STUART

Emma Kathryn Stuart is originally from Melbourne Australia. She spent 3 years in Neukölln Berlin. Went to Istanbul, bought a Saz (Turkish guitar) where she was given the name Eminé by some Turkish friends. Wrote some catchy pop songs on the Saz.

Eminé has played numerous gigs in Berlin, Melbourne and Alice Springs since 2014. Now living in Alice Springs singing and painting trees.
