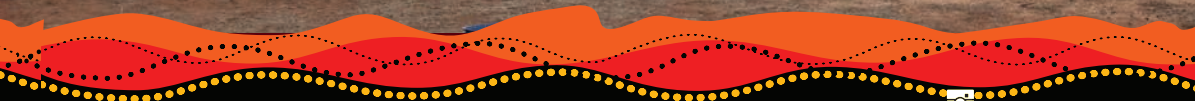

Presenting THE MALA TRIO - Concert pianist Stefan Cassomenos, Monica Curro Assistant Principal Violin-MSO and Jonathan Tooby Cellist and Conductor - Darwin Symphony Orchestra, in a scintillating program of HAYDN (Trio No 45 in E-flat major, Hob XV:29) KATSCHERNIN (Calliope Dreaming - 2008), and MENDELSSOHN (Trio No 1 in d minor, Op 49). The 'Concert Hall' will also feature the Arafura Music Collective and other Festival Artists. A 'not to be missed' classical extravaganza.

Franz Josef "Papa" Haydn is universally regarded as the father of the piano trio, the string quartet and the symphony, and was an important mentor to both Mozart and Beethoven. The Mala Trio presents the last of his 45 piano trios, followed by Elena Kats-Chernin's Calliope Dreaming, inspired by Haydn's 44th Symphony, steam whistles, and the muse of epic poetry. The Piano Trio no.1 in d minor was praised by Schumann as "the master-trio of our time" and endures as one of Mendelssohn's most often performed and loved works.

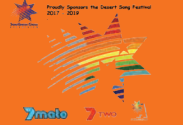
